

The season of Lent

The season of Lent is a time when Christians traditionally reflect and prepare for the celebrations of Easter. It is a time where some people give up: they fast, eat more simply or give up treats to follow the example of Jesus, who fasted for forty days in the wilderness.

People also give out in Lent. They may give to charity, make time for others, and set time aside to study the Bible and reflect on Jesus' life as they prepare for Holy Week and Easter.

On the night he was betrayed, Jesus kneels in darkness in the Garden of Gethsemane. Although he pleads with his disciples, "Stay here with me... Watch and pray," they all fall asleep, leaving him alone in his time of great suffering.

This season of Lent, we invite your school to join us as we **Watch and Pray.**

These Lent resources draw on the wisdom of Black Spirituality and have been inspired and informed by the 2024 Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent book, Tarry Awhile:
Wisdom from Black Spirituality for people of faith by Selina Stone (SPCK). There is also a daily challenge booklet for children and families (CHP) which is closely linked to our resources.

Loving God, you have created the world and everyone in it. Help us to watch out for signs of your goodness in our world, in other people and in ourselves



Read the story of Ruth and Naomi's journey. In Ruth 1.15-22, a young widow chooses to travel with and care for her mother-in-law, Naomi, rather than stay in her own country.

Think of a place where you have felt close to God. It is often easy to feel close to God in a church, cathedral or other place of worship, or out in nature. What places are special to you?

Pray on the move. On your journey to or from school, notice the places around you. Say a prayer for the people who live, work and play there.








I wonder...

Sit in silence for a while. Like Moses, the prophet Elijah hears God's voice on a mountain. But God meets Elijah not in fire but in silence.

Include someone who might feel left out. It is good to spend some time quietly on our own. But it's good to talk and have fun with others, too!

Pray for those who feel forgotten. The Book of Job describes bad things happening to a good person. Pray for anyone finding it hard to feel God cares about them.


